

HOUSING

Homeownership is one of the most effective ways to build wealth. Approximately 70% of all lowans own a home. Here are lowa homeownership rates by race/ethnicity:



ICUF has supported nearly 300 lowans in purchasing homes through Individual Development Accounts with lowa credit unions.

BUSINESS OWNERSHIP

More than 99% of lowa businesses are small businesses. 10% are owned by minorities.

- ICUF supported more than 120 small businesses with emergency relief during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Small business owners accessed \$112,000 in matched savings through ICUF's Individual Development Account program.



CHILDCARE


More than 1/4 of lowans live in a childcare desert. Annually, lowa loses out on an estimated \$935 million in economic activity due to lack of childcare.

Since 2019, ICUF has provided grant support to the Iowa Women's Foundation to improve accessibility to rural childcare providers.



EMPLOYMENT

lowa's overall unemployment rate is 4.2%. Here is lowa's unemployment rate by race/ ethnicity:
